Dance Photography Project



Over a year ago some of our students took part in a Dance Photography Project, where they worked with professional photographer and choreographer Mark Anderson from InfuseDANCE and Clare Wood, a dance teacher from Dancefest (a community dance company based in Worcester). The project was to mark Dancefest's 30th anniversary by working with dance groups, schools and community groups to use dance and photography to reimagine buildings and spaces in Worcester.

Unfortunately, Covid-19 prevented the project from being realised, and our students were unable to complete the offsite part of the project where the final images were to be created. However, over Easter 'Reimagine', a large-scale outdoor photography trail, was finally able to go ahead, and the images were set up around Worcester City Centre. Some excellent photos were taken around the school site during our rehearsals, four of which appear as part of the project. Many of you will have seen them over the Easter holidays and I hope you agree that they are absolutely first class. We congratulate all students involved in the project.

Sixth Form




