In Science 10R-Cobalt worked very hard revising metals and their reactions ready for an upcoming assessment.







Viya Patel has worked really hard since September and is proving herself to be an excellent student of English.


Armands Zvaigzne has worked impressively this term and is certainly deserving of his commendation point in English.


Year 8

8 Lisbon made impressive posters this week that showcased everything they have learnt in the past fortnight about different types of charts and graphs. All the graphs are about their own lives.



Richard Weston continues to work very hard in English both in class and at home.


Melody Brown has been applying herself with determination in German, producing some fine written work about herself and her siblings.
