

## Use of the Pupil Premium 2020/21 and Plans for 2021/2022

In 2020/21 the school was allocated £243,090. The primary purpose of the Pupil Premium is to improve the outcomes of students entitled to free school meals and those in the care of the local authority. For this reason, the school invested in resources and staffing which directly benefited those students. We focused on four key areas:

- attendance and access;
- curriculum enrichment and academic support;
- enhancing employability;
- inclusion and pastoral support.

## Impact upon GCSE Results in 2021:

- In 2020 40% of pupil premium pupils achieved 5 GCSEs grade 4 or above including English and Maths. This was in line with the expectations for this cohort.
- 64% of pupils gained at least a grade 4 in English
- 47 % of pupils gained at least a grade 4 in mathematics

## Plans for 2021/2022

For the academic year 2020/2021 the school expects to receive £260,980. In addition to the areas above the School will use its PP funds to focus on these areas of need following the disruption to learning as result of the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Pastoral support
- Support for mental health
- Academic catch up
