Year 13 were carrying out forensic techniques and producing a genetic fingerprint. They all conducted themselves well in a professional environment and were able to appreciate the value of their lab skills.



Students in 11C Drama are all making good progress with their final touches to their practical assessment in devising (acting and technical theatre).


Sam Ballard has demonstrated a consistent and conscientious attitude to Physics.
