

Lottie Mountford's art work to be displayed at the railway station

Lottie Mountford's art work has impressed so many people that it has been chosen for display at the town railway station.

Lottie designed four pieces as part of her Extended Project Qualification. The Friends of Droitwich Train Station have asked for them to be them printed on acrylic and displayed for those who pass through this busy station.





The four pieces which Lottie has created show historical maps of the town overlaid with two of its most famous residents and an image associated with each of them. On one plate is a portrait of John Corbett; paired with it is the Chateau Impney, designed and built in the 1870s to please his wife. The other two pair show Edward Winslow and The Mayflower, the ship that

famously took him and 119 other pilgrims across the Atlantic in 1620.

Lottie says of her work: 'My intention was to celebrate the diverse history of our community in art form. After some research I discovered that the people of Droitwich were most interested in two key figureheads of Droitwich, Edward Winslow and John Corbett. These are accompanied by two other studies, one of the Mayflower and another of the Chateau, their corresponding ventures. All the pieces are laid over archived vintage maps of the surrounding area and the composition was then built in layers of controlled pen work. I decided to stick to black and white as a nod to the heritage of the pieces whilst pen allowed me to capture the detail of the subjects.'

Lottie's work will be available to view at the station in the next couple of weeks.

casualty had no pulse and was not breathing. Thanks to the first-aid training which students received as part of the Sport & Physical Activity (Cambridge Technical) the sixth former able to perform CPR and use a defibrillator to deliver three shocks. The patient then regained a pulse. When the ambulance arrived [more than 15 minutes later], the patient had a heartbeat and was breathing.


Bella appears in subway art
